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OVERVIEW/SUMMARY

The RHS Housing Advisory Committee met Wednesday, May 24th, at the Alliant Energy Center, to learn more about different strategies at the regional and national levels that could potentially be included within the Regional Strategic Action Plan. The goal was to provide a baseline understanding of the various tools available and the current use of those tools across the country. HAC members completed individual worksheets and engaged in table discussions to identify strategies that could be implemented in Dane County. After the meeting, HAC members were invited to rank all strategies to date via SurveyMonkey. Based off of the feedback received, the HAC will move forward with a draft list of strategies for the Regional Strategic Action Plan. 
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HAC DRAFT STRATEGIES FEEDBACK (REGIONAL/NATIONAL)

HAC members listened to five (5) rounds of presentations focused on regional and national case studies outlining various strategies. The presentations were organized by each of the five (5) housing priorities. After each presentation, HAC members wrote their thoughts, ideas, and questions about the case studies within the housing priority on individual worksheets. With room to brainstorm additional strategies and star their favorite, members then turned to table discussions to share their thoughts with others.

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POST HAC STRATEGY RANKING SURVEY RESULTS

The Regional Strategic Action Plan (SAP) will be the roadmap for countywide housing strategy over the next 3-5 years. Strategies in the SAP will be organized by the five (5) essential housing priorities developed through a collaborative process by the HAC. HAC members helped identify the strategies most aligned with their understanding of the needs and opportunities by participating in the post HAC #8 survey. As a reminder, the final strategies will reflect the following core values of the SAP: Accountability, Affordability, Economic Growth, Empowerment, Equity, and Sustainable Development. Please find below the top three ranking strategies from each housing priority based on the follow-up survey responses. Please note, the strategies identified below are NOT the only/final list of strategies that will be included in the SAP.
